Day Treatment Program

Glade Run's Day Treatment Program for at-risk youth is an alternative to substitute care for adjudicated/court involved delinquent or dependent youth, ages 12 to 21.

About the Day Treatment Program

The Day Treatment Program provides alternative education for adjudicated deliquent and/or dependent youth in grades 9-12. It operates in cooperation with the Juvenile Court Services, Pennsylvania Department of Human Services and the Pennsylvania Department of Education.

The program operates Monday through Friday during the school year, eight and a half hours per day. After hours crisis support for clients enrolled in the program is available twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, during program operation.

Coordination of Care

Glade Run will ensure that care is coordinated with the physical health HMO, including the primary care provider (PCP) and any medical specialists, other mental health and/or drug and alcohol providers, other social service agencies and providers of crisis services. If all treatment services needed by a client are not available from a provider, the client will be referred as needed to other providers within a reasonable distance from the clients location.

Program Admission

- Clients must be 12 and 21 years of age.
- Clients between 18 and 21 years of age should either be:
 - enrolled full time in high school, secondary education and/or vocational training
 - under the supervision of Children and Youth Services or Juvenile Probation

Referrals

Referrals are made to the program through school districts located in Butler County as well as neighboring school districts in other counties. There is no cost for children or adolescents who are enrolled in the program. Children may or may not have an individualized Education Plan upon referral.
