

Psychiatric Mobile Medication

Serving Butler County



Glade Run is launching a new Psychiatric Mobile Medication program to serve Butler County adults 18 and over with a diagnosed serious mental illness, a history of repeated acute inpatient admissions and patterns that include poor medication adherence and/or consistent substance utilization post discharge.

The goal of this program is to prevent hospitalization caused by limited insight into illness, lack of understanding of the purpose and benefit of medications and other factors. The program will provide needed assessment, support and skill development to those individuals who have a high degree of functional impairment associated with medication adherence that impacts their illness management and recovery.

Basic eligibility requirements include:

- Being a resident of Butler County and at least 18 years of age.
 - Must have a current SMI diagnosis as verified by a physician or licensed psychologist. Exceptions will be considered on a case by case basis.
 - Must have a current or planned prescription for psychiatric medications and a presenting issue or concern relative to prescribed medications.
 - Eligible exceptions will be considered for uninsured individuals on a case by case basis.
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- An individual's duration of service will be dependent on their level of service needed at the time of entry and progress during the course of service delivery.
 - Face-to-face interactions for this program are considered vital. Services may be delivered in the home, community, provider or office setting.
 - All individuals successfully discharged from the program will be offered the opportunity to receive continued services for a period of two (2) years post-discharge at a follow-up level of care.

Referral Process

- Referrals may be made by professional service providers including acute inpatient psychiatric units, Torrance State Hospital, Butler County Human Services, Blended Case Management Program, a Peer Specialist, the Base Service Unit, MH Crisis program and physicians.
- Individuals may self-refer to this program.
- Individuals referred for the Psychiatric Mobile Medication program will require an intake assessment by a Program Mental Health Professional to ensure eligibility and determine the initial level of service intensity.
- Program experiences are individualized and based on assessment of symptoms and functioning.
